his publication provides an overview of the individual members of the International Pierre de Coubertin Committee (IPCC), the National Pierre de Coubertin Committees and the International Network of Pierre de Coubertin Schools. It describes the IPCC and those who keep alive the spirit of Pierre de Coubertin (1863-1937), showing that his ideas are integrated in today's world.

It aims to provide all members with an opportunity to communicate and interact with one another in a concise way and to strengthen their collaboration within the areas of their individual interests. It also seeks to facilitate communication and increase awareness about the IPCC and its place in society. We encourage you to visit our website, https://www.coubertin.org, and to enter into dialogue with us on the life and work of Pierre de Coubertin, the academic activities of the IPCC and its educational knowledge transfer projects.

HOW THIS PROJECT EVOLVED

In July 2019, Natalia Camps Y Wilant and Stephan Wassong discussed the idea of developing an IPCC members' directory. This initial discussion led to the preparation of a standardized questionnaire to collect all of the members' data and compile the information in a printed booklet. At the IPCC Board meeting in November 2019, the project was approved by the participants and the project team, accompanied by Elvira Ramini, started the pilot phase by sending test questionnaires to randomly chosen individual members and national committees. The idea was to present the successful result of the pilot phase and the collected data sample at the IPCC Board meeting in March 2020 so that the Board members would approve the project, its pragmatic management and, above all, the value of its expected results.

Unfortunately, at the beginning of 2020, the Covid-19 virus spread worldwide, slowing down daily life, and consequently also affected work on this project. As a result, the Board members cancelled the planned meeting and some projects were put on hold during the following months, among them the members' directory.


Luckily, the project was picked up again in December 2020. The questionnaires were successfully sent out to all members. Out of 116 individual members, 73 participated, equivalent to a return rate of 85%. The return rate was 100% for the national committees, including one additional committee newly recognized by the IPCC in the intervening period.

The paper shortage within the printing industry in the autumn of 2021 was another drawback, and the project fell behind schedule. The project team did not want to jeopardize the desired quality of the project, so another postponement was proposed and accepted by the Board members in December 2021. At the following General Assembly in January 2022, a new publication date was agreed upon for the summer of 2022. The following months were spent creating the layout, editing and proofreading and finally distributing the publication among all the IPCC members.

In conclusion, it is important to stress that the project does not end with this publication. A database will allow for an additional digital portrait of the IPCC. It will be more than a mere list of members. It will enable communication and administrative functionalities that will facilitate processes on an individual, national and international level. Currently, the database project team, made up of Marco Tomasini, Elvira Ramini and Natalia Camps Y Wilant, is working on different tasks. The release of the database platform is planned for the spring of 2023.

Reflections of the IPCC on the 1892 Olympic

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FACSIMILE OF THE FOUNDATION SPEECH LEFT: PAGE 1, RIGHT: PAGE 14 // © IOC Pierre de Coubertin presented his idea to revive the modern Olympic Games for the first time in public at the fifth anniversary of the Union des Sociétés Françaises de Sports Athlétiques (USFSA) in November 1892. The USFSA was the umbrella organization for the promotion of sport in France, founded in 1889 and later joined by Coubertin. The place for the speech was well chosen, as it was the auditorium of the old Sorbonne, attributing academic value to the celebration and his idea of the re-establishment of the modern Olympic Games. At the end of his 14-page speech, Coubertin said the following:

"As for athletics in general, I do not know what its fate will be, but I wish to draw your attention to the important fact that it presents two new features (...). It is democratic and international. (...). As for the second, it opens an unexpected prospect to us. (...). Let us export rowers, runners and fencers; this is the free trade of the future, and the day that it is introduced into the everyday existence of old Europe, the cause of peace will receive new and powerful support.

That is enough to encourage me to think now about the second part of my programme. I hope that you will help me as you have helped me thus far and that, with you, I shall be able to continue and realize, on a basis appropriate to the condition." (see photo of page 14 of the facsimile).

Despite the passive reaction, the topic had been addressed officially and recognized by a sport-oriented public. This probably paved the way for Coubertin's success in 1894 in Paris when it was decided to re-establish the modern Olympic Games. Between 25 November 1892 (the date of the speech) and 23 June 1894 (the day the decision was taken), Coubertin found support for his idea in France, Great Britain and the USA. Hence, the speech delivered in November can be regarded as the foundation speech for the modern Olympic Games.

IPCC President Stephan Wassong has been analysing Coubertin's speech in his lectures and publications. He highlights the following central ideas:

In his speech, Coubertin stresses the ancient roots of sport, which he links to physical culture in ancient Greece. However, his main focus was the development of modern sport and the fact that sport had to be regarded as an educational tool for character development and hence as a vehicle to support the education of the modern citizen.

According to Coubertin, the educational role of sport was coined in scholastic contexts at English public schools (private, mainly boarding, schools) and universities. It seemed to be important for him to mention that sport and its educational value spread to the world from

England. He refers among other things to countries of the Commonwealth, the USA and France. Coubertin's views were based on data collected by way of an international survey which he himself carried out in 1889 to analyse the increasing prestige of sport in educational settings. He carried out the survey for the International Congress on Physical Education, which he co-organized during the 1889 Paris World Fair. The survey is one of the very first conducted on the status of physical education on the international level.

In his speech, Coubertin stresses the fact that sport had developed into an international phenomenon, which was enjoying increasing popularity worldwide. For him, this was the motivation for expanding the educational impact of sport by adding an international dimension to it. He clearly stresses this view at the end of his speech, which makes it vital in terms of understanding the reason behind Coubertin's intention to revive the Olympic Games. Coubertin argues that the international nature of sport was the prerequisite to bringing athletes from different nations together, an objective that was supported by the innovations in the transport system at that time. He certainly recognized this novelty and encouraged advocates of sport to use it to their advantage.

After further analysis of this part of Coubertin's speech, one could assert that the aim of international meetings should not be athletic competition only. According to Coubertin, international athletic festivals/competitions should provide an opportunity to communicate with representatives of other nations and learn more about their cultures, thus reducing mistrust and prejudice against other nations, which was regarded as one of the driving forces behind the outbreak of armed conflicts.

Coubertin's vision of educational internationalism is rooted in the recommendations of the World Peace Conferences, staged since 1889. He knew about the conference recommendations and believed that the Olympic Games could make a contribution in that regard. Bearing this in mind, one can defuse some challenging and also erroneous academic notions that Coubertin established the Olympic Games only to stimulate the slow development of sport in France at the time. This speech proves that such statements lack academic validity.

The speech also confirms that Coubertin proposed the re-establishment of the Olympic Games in order to stress the educational value of sport in general and to serve as a basic platform for strengthening transnational understanding in particular. This is an academically proven explanation of why Coubertin proposed the re-establishment of the Olympic Games.

The link between Coubertin's speech of 1892 and the modern mission of the IOC proves that Coubertin's thoughts and ideas do not remain in the past. They continue to be relevant to the current Olympic Movement and its impact on societies across the globe. Their application undoubtedly requires a contemporary reading of Coubertin and the adaptation of his ideas to the present day. It is clear from Coubertin's writings that he was not opposed to this. On the contrary, he encouraged it, as he believed that the adaptation of his Olympic ideas to changing conditions in sport and society was important for the authenticity of Olympism.




Introduction to the IPCC

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t was in Lausanne, the Olympic capital, that the initiative was taken to create an international committee to preserve, analyse and disseminate the works and thoughts of Pierre de Coubertin. The Comité International Pierre de Coubertin (CIPC), in English the International Pierre de Coubertin Committee (IPCC), was founded on 19 January 1975. The founding members, Paul Martin and Jacques Guhl, personally knew Pierre de Coubertin. Their initiative was based on their primary intention to make the founder of the modern Olympic Games known worldwide and remind the world of Coubertin's true purpose for this renovation, based on the embedded values of integrity of the Olympic Games.

The International Olympic Committee (IOC) understood the importance of the undertaking by Coubertin's faithful followers and assisted them in setting up the International Pierre de Coubertin Committee in Lausanne, subsequently granting it official recognition in 1984.

Right from the very beginning, the number of people wanting to contribute to the mission of making known Pierre de Coubertin and his work has been growing. Under the leadership of the former presidents (Paul Martin, Geoffrey de Navacelle, Conrado Durántez, Norbert Müller) and the current president, Stephan Wassong, numerous projects have been realized, and the enthusiasm continues. Some exceptional projects are mentioned briefly in this publication.

CONFERENCES

he first IPCC Conference took place in March 1986 in Lausanne and was entitled *The Relevance of* Pierre de Coubertin Today. It was during this conference that the project on the publication of Coubertin's writings was approved and initiated as a joint project between the IPCC and the IOC. In order to maintain the tradition, on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of the second IOC Olympic Congress held in Le Havre (1897), the IPCC organized its second conference entitled Coubertin and Olympism -Ouestions for the Future in the same city in 1997. The next IPCC Conference took place in 2014 at the Olympic Museum in Lausanne and was entitled Pierre de Coubertin and the Future. These events provided meaningful opportunities to bring together IPCC members from different countries to exchange ideas and the results of their research.





PUBLICATIONS


The IPCC has published the reports of all of its conferences. In addition, it publishes the e-journal *Diogoras: International Academic Journal on Olympic Studies* in collaboration with the International Olympic Studies Centres of the German Sport University Cologne, the University of Canterbury (NZ), the Autonomous University of Barcelona (ESP) and the Paul Valéry University of Montpellier 3 (FRA). In line with its mission, the IPCC collaborates and assists its members with their projects and publications. For example, the IPCC collaborated on and made available the translations of the book by former IPCC vice-president Jean Durry, *Le Vrai Pierre de Coubertin*, which is currently available in French, English, Portuguese, Spanish and Japanese.

As it is our objective to disseminate academic research and transfer knowledge on Pierre de Coubertin and his educational ideas, we have started to digitalize relevant publications on Pierre de Coubertin. Olympism. Olympic education and the Olympic Movement. It is important to stress that the IPCC focuses not only on its own publications but also on those by other authors who have given permission to upload their books on the IPCC website. We wish to draw readers' attention to Pierre de Coubertin (1863-1937). Olympism - Selected Writings, edited by Norbert Müller and published by the IOC. It is a benchmark for Olympic history research, and its translation into several languages allows for the work of Pierre de Coubertin to be made known worldwide. ther interesting projects have focused on Pierre de Coubertin's lifelong enthusiasm for art. This is illustrated in his initiative to include art competitions in the Olympic Games programme. The art competitions were designed to contribute to the celebration of the Olympic Games as a unique festival at which competitors and spectators alike would experience a new aesthetic dimension of balanced harmony between athletics. culture and education.

Pierre de Coubertin inherited his ancestors' talents and his passion for the arts from his father, Charles Frédy, Baron de Coubertin, a respected painter in France and abroad. The exhibition entitled Coubertin and the Arts displays a selection of works of art that underline the Coubertin family's artistic nature. The exhibition itself was designed by Norbert Müller, late honorary IPCC president, Christian Wacker, IPCC member, Yvan de Navacelle de Coubertin, IPCC honorary member, and Marcia De Franceschi Neto. It was presented for the first time on the occasion of the Rio 2016 Olympic Games at the Olympic Village and then at the Club France in Rio de Janeiro. At that time, the panels were presented in English, French and Portuguese. As the exhibition attracted a large number of visitors, IPCC President Stephan Wassong decided to set it up as

a virtual exhibition, thus enabling access to a much broader audience. https://www.coubertin.org/pierre-de-coubertin/introducing-baron-pierre-de-coubertin/coubertin-and-the-arts-virtual-exhibition/. The Japanese edition of this exhibition was dedicated to the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games.

The IPCC has realized other artistic projects by commissioning several works from the artist and sculptor Karlheinz Oswald. His Pierre de Coubertin Medal is a highly valued IPCC distinction and is awarded for outstanding initiatives. The front of the medal bears a portrait of Pierre de Coubertin and the reverse features Pierre de Coubertin's leitmotif: *Voir Loin – Parler Franc – Agir Ferme*. Karlheinz Oswald's Pierre de Coubertin Bust is awarded by the IPCC to institutions such as museums.





arlheinz Oswald also created the impressive statue of the founder of the modern Olympic Games, Pierre de Coubertin. On the occasion of the 60th anniversary of the International Olympic Academy (IOA), IPCC President Stephan Wassong presented the artwork on-site on 17 October 2021 as part of the inaugural celebrations for the renovated IOA premises. The President of the IOA, Isidoros Kouvelos, expressed his thanks during his speech at the event, which was also attended by IOC President Thomas Bach and IOC Executive Board members. The statue is situated in the central part of the atrium of the IOA auditorium. Since its foundation in 1975, the IPCC has developed strong ties with the IOA in research and teaching activities. Members of the IPCC are regularly invited as lecturers at IOA sessions. Furthermore, teachers in the International Network of Coubertin Schools are given the opportunity to attend seminar weeks at the IOA to further their Olympic expertise. he IPCC translated Pierre de Coubertin's focus on the youth of the world into two initiatives. Following Coubertin's idea of peace and friendship among nations. Norbert Müller initiated the organization of International Pierre de Coubertin Youth Forums, the first of which took place in 1997 with the participation of six Coubertin schools from four countries. The aim was to provide the younger generations with an understanding of Coubertin's Olympic idea and enable them to experience the values of friendship, fairness, respect and the joy of effort. Since 1997. 12 International Youth Forums have taken place, with a steadily rising number of participating delegations and countries as well as increasing numbers of

schools loyal to the network. The latest edition of the Forum, held in Mâcon in 2019, set a new record by welcoming an unprecedented 25 delegations from 23 countries. Its motto, Olympism at school. It must be encouraged! (the title of an article by Coubertin in 1934), was well chosen as it stressed a central pillar of the IPCC. Mission of the IPCC

Il IPCC activities are embedded in its mission. Overall, the IPCC's primary goals and guiding principles have not changed fundamentally. The latest updates to the IPCC Statutes were carried out by the project team, made up of Annett Chojnacki-Bennemann, Elvira Ramini, Alexandre Mestre and Stephan Wassong, and recently ratified by the General Assembly on 29 January 2022.

THIS IS THE MISSION OF THE IPCC:

- To seek to make known the works of Pierre de Coubertin in their entirety, to identify the main lines of his thinking and to ensure their dissemination throughout the world to contribute to human development and find solutions to current problems;
- To promote and foster the study of Pierre de Coubertin's integral humanism and his pedagogical and social thinking to identify more precisely the moral, civic, cultural and pedagogical teaching resulting from these;

- To translate Pierre de Coubertin's educational leitmotifs into our times to strengthen an objective identification with Coubertin as the founder of the Olympic Movement and promoter of sport as an educational tool for character development, social change and transcultural respect;
- To coordinate such study entrusted to the IPCC members or external experts selected based on their specific expertise;
- To contribute to the adoption of rules and methods following such teaching, from which the Olympic Spirit originates;
- To honour and reward those people, bodies or entities whose conduct or activity best serves the ideals of Pierre de Coubertin:
- To work with those national and international organizations that have undertaken to disseminate the Olympic Spirit and further the legacy of Pierre de Coubertin;

 To ensure the international coordination of the activities of its members in their respective countries and any Pierre de Coubertin committees that it has officially recognized.

As its presence has gradually mounted across the five continents, the impact of the IPCC has become increasingly substantial over the past four decades. Objectively, it is comforting to note that a team of volunteers has obtained such concrete results through various initiatives. Finally, it should be stressed that the unique support of the IOC throughout all of these years has contributed significantly to strengthening the profile of the IPCC.

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

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

He also writes occasional pieces on Coubertin for the IOC and others. He is now collaborating with Natalia Camps on an article about Pierre de Coubertin's correspondence with women.



I am one of the three editors-in-chief of the e-journal Diagoras. The editorial board of this International Academic Journal on Olympic Studies has been joined by the IPCC in 2018. My research work focuses mainly on the US-American influence on Pierre de Coubertin. Furthermore, I am interested and have worked on the following topics: modern reading of Coubertin, Coubertin as an advanced educator, Olympic Movement and Sport for All, athletes in the Olympic Movement, development of governance structures of the IOC, problems of amateurism and doping in the Olympic Movement, history of the International Olympic Academy, Olympic Movement and politics and concept of Olympic Education. 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First of all, the most important thing for me is that the Olympic Games continue to respect Pierre de Coubertin's visions and ideas and that sport stays clean from doping. Some years ago, I gave the former IPCC president, Prof. Dr Norbert Müller, the inspiration to introduce climbing to the Olympic Games which finally happened for the 32nd summer Olympic Games of 2020 which were postponed to 2021. Norbert Müller and I also had the idea to create a Pierre de Coubertin committee in Luxembourg which never happened because of a lack of interest and no reaction from the National Olympic Committee. But I still haven't given up the idea ... maybe one day. What is very important for me is to use sport to educate children. As a teacher I use sports to teach mathematics. My bachelor thesis, for example, was dedicated to combining mathematics and sports. My idea is to introduce in primary schools in Luxembourg a special prize for children who reach outstanding achievements in sports, arts and in one of the main school subjects: Mathematics, French, German (and maybe Science, Geography and History) in order to motivate them.

- » Pierre de Coubertin Committee of Argentina was founded with the objective to promote and spread information about the life and work of Baron Pierre de Coubertin, his educational, sports and cultural legacy. Our academic and institutional activities consist of organizing conferences, seminars and symposia which are followed by publication of papers and result of research work.
- The Pierre de Coubertin Committee of Argentina is represented and collaborates academically with the following institutions: the International Pierre de Coubertin Committee, National Olympic Committee of Argentina, national Pierre de Coubertin committees in Latin America, the Sports Confederation of Córdoba, Ministries of Education, and Universities/Institutes of Physical Education.

- » Our collaboration with other institutions is based on agreements with the Catholic University of Santiago del Estero, the Blas Pascal University of Córdoba, and, in the near future, the Faculty of Physical Education of the National University of Tucumán.
- We have organized the First National Academic Day Pierre de Coubertin 150 years since his birth in 2013 and the First Latin American Symposium on Pierre de Coubertin in 2015 in Córdoba.
- » In recent years our committee members participated in the Brazilian Symposium on Olympic Studies, as guest speakers at the Educators Session of the International Olympic Academy, and at the 2nd Latin American Symposium and 1st International Congress on Olympism held in Colombia.

The Czech Pierre de Coubertin Committee has one representative in the Czech Olympic Academy Executive Board since 2021. In recent years, we have organized several seminars on research in history. Our members have co-operated in publishing books, worked on historical research and exhibitions. The Czech Pierre de Coubertin Committee gives financial support to the Gymnasium Pierra de Coubertina in Tábor.

The main activities in the last 5 years were the following:

- » Seminar on history, Sport and Art (2016), Ancient Days in Brno (2019) and proceedings.
- » Olympic Encyclopaedia: Czech and Czechoslovakian athletes at Olympics (2021). Members of our committee worked on the book for five years under the guidance of František Kolář.
- » The Czech Pierre de Coubertin Committee plans to work on all Olympic Games during the time of Pierre de Coubertin (1896-1936), and during his lifetime as a whole, because books on individual Olympic Games were not published in the Czech Republic before 1948. We have already finished two publications: Rebirth of the Olympic Games (2020) and Antwerp 1920: for the first time at the Olympic Games under the Czechoslovakian flag (2021). A book and an exhibition on the 90th anniversary of LA 1932 and the Czechoslovakian team will be released and presented next year.

The Spanish Pierre de Coubertin Committee has among its objectives the study of the personality, life and work of Pierre de Coubertin. For this, its president, D. Conrado Durántez has written numerous publications on the work of the humanist and his social, cultural, educational and moral principles.

In order to collaborate with other institutions in the implementation of the Olympic Spirit and the transmission of the heritage and legacy of the distinguished pedagogue, the Spanish Pierre de Coubertin Committee has created a project called "Spanish Network of Coubertin Schools". This summons a good number of educational centers in our country and from among them one is chosen to represent Spain in international meetings dedicated to the figure of Pierre de Coubertin.

The US Pierre de Coubertin Committee (USPCC) was very active in the 2019/20 year. At the 2019 meeting, the International Pierre de Coubertin Committee formally recognized the reactivation of the USPCC under the leadership of Secretary General George Hirthler and President Gary Rhodes. USPCC leadership presented at the IOC and the USOPC headquarters, was represented at the Coubertin Youth Forum in France, the Youth Summer Olympics in Argentina and Youth Winter Olympics in Switzerland, and attended and presented at a number of conferences in the US and internationally. Meetings with representatives of the French Pierre de Coubertin Committee and US

organizations supporting the Los Angeles 2028 Summer Olympics and Paralympics were held to support collaboration leading to Paris, 2024 and Los Angeles, 2028. Legal work is being completed to ensure the appropriate recognition of the USPCC as a non-profit organization. A leadership board is being recruited with broad ranging representation in the US. A new website has been developed (www.Coubertin.us). Planning is underway to support the development and implementation of a Coubertin in America Symposium (Olympism in Action) in the US in 2021. Through these and other collaborative efforts, the USPCC is moving forward to the 2020/21.

The Pierre de Coubertin Committee -Uruguay -has the same tasks as the IPCC, and since its foundation in 2016, it has addressed the study of the life and work of Pierre de Coubertin, carrying out research, publication and dissemination work in different media, especially in the field of education and academia.

During the school period and in years of the Olympic Games, primary schools, secondary schools, universities, centres of public interest, the media (newspapers, radios, TV) are visited throughout the country.

Before our committee was founded, we participated in symposia on Coubertin and Olympism in: 2015 (Córdoba, ARG), 2016 (Rio de Janeiro), 2017 (Porto Alegre), 2018 (Buenos Aires), 2019 (Pereira .COL). Since 2020 we are part of the Latin American Centre for Coubertinian Studies, conducting research, publications, and dissertations in collaboration with the IPCC Secretariat.

We have our own headquarters with a library and a Coubertinian and Olympic Studies Centre.

We have become a certified centre for research in Olympic sport activities in Uruguay, recognized for our serious approach in scientific investigations.

In 2021 we made a four-year agreement with the French Embassy in Montevideo to promote the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, coinciding with the first 100 years of participation of Uruguay at Olympic Games (Paris 1924).

Our members come from different professional backgrounds linked to sport and Olympism: sport leaders, teachers, Olympic medallists, researchers, academics, leaders in the National Departments, journalists, elite athletes, etc. which allows us to fulfil our tasks and missions in a wide range of the country.

In addition, we have a very broad relationship with the Uruguayan government and with the embassies of host countries of the Olympic Games which allow us to establish dialogue about Coubertin and Olympism, and to exchange information about the culture of each country.








